- Identify the decision-making process of healthcare workers.
- Improve standard of care and patient satisfaction

Methods


- Nationwide survey study
- Urologists, rehabilitation doctors, (continence)nurses and physician assistants in the Netherlands.

Results

- 108 responders
- 45% continence nurse, 43% urologist
- 85% preferred CIC
- 55% managed more IDCs
